
BUGS ON THE RUG ACTIVITY

Materials

Paper Copier Glue Scissors

Directions

- I. Using these examples of free internet clip art, make copies the rug and bug art on separate pieces of 8 1/2 x 11 paper.
 - 2. Cut out the individual bugs.
- 3. Allow each child to select one bug that they wish to paste on their individual rug.
- 4. Allow each child to paste the bug they have selected on their rug (one bug per page).





- 5. Once the children have pasted the bugs on their rugs, staple the pages together to create a new book to sing and read.
- 6. Another option is to let each child select and paste as many bugs as they wish onto their individual rugs.
- 7. Finally, make a mural in the classroom or home of a rug, and allow the children to affix bugs to the mural.




EXTENSION ACTIVITY

Once the bugs are pasted onto the rug, extend the learning experience to a counting lesson by counting the number of bugs the child has pasted on the rug. Then, count the number of winged bugs verses the number of crawly bugs. Next, count the number of eyes, wings or legs.

HOW MANY BUGS DO YOU SEE?

Count the bugs on each row and draw a line to match the correct number.





EXTENSION ACTIVITY

To extend the learning beyond this matching lesson, make a copy of this page and cut out the rows of bugs separate from the numbers. Paste the bug rows and the numbers on individual index cards to create a card deck of pictures and numbers. Shuffle the deck. Spread the cards on the table or floor and ask the children to match the picture cards with their corresponding number cards.

RHYMING WORD MATCH

Draw a line to match the bugs with their rhyming word partners.
