

Story Stretcher

Here are some ways to stretch the story beyond the book.

- 1. Read the story to your class.
- 2. Read the book again and ask the children to create the movements for the animals from each page. For example, the pelican flies; therefore, the children would make flying motions with their arms or hands.
- 3. Next, sing the story with the students as you turn the book pages.
- 4. Ask the students to count the animals on the pages.
- 5. How many total animals are in the book?
- 6. The illustrator has hidden numbers throughout the book. Ask the children to find the hidden numbers.
- 7. Discuss animal habitats with the students. Ask the children if they can recall some of the animal habitats in the book.
- 8. Several animals in the book are official state animals. For example, the pelican is the state bird, the black bear is the state bear, the Catahoula is the state dog, the alligator is the state reptile and the crawfish is the state crustacean. Review these with students.
- 9. Make a graph of the student's favorite animals.
- 10. Ask the children to create collage illustrations of their favorite animal in the book and compile them to create their own book.
- 11. Create a skit of the book to perform for an assembly.

Rhythm Band

Let's add some musical instruments to spice up the book. Sing the song and play the following instruments to create a soundscape for the animal actions in the book.

Instruments	Animal	Action words
Triangle	pelican	fly, flew
Guiro Rhythm sticks	armadillo black bear	dig, dug climb, climbed
Tambourine	alligator gar	swim, swam
Drum	Catahoulas	bark, barked
Maracas	nutrias	eat, ate
Sand blocks	possums	sleep, slept
Spoons	crawfish	snap, snapped
Wood block	alligator	sun, sunned
Bells	mosquitoes	buzz, buzzed

Instructions:

- 1) Assign the above instruments and the animals they represent to your students.
- 2) Instruct the students to only play their instrument when their assigned animal and corresponding action word appears in the book. For example, the triangle will play only when the words "fly" and "flew" for the pelican are read or sung. The guiro will play only when the words "dig" and "dug" for the armadillo are read or sung.
- 3) Enjoy the music!




